What is the Transportation System Plan?

The Transportation System Plan (TSP) is a long-range document that guides the expansion and operation of our transportation network for all modes of travel over the next 20 years. The City's current TSP was adopted in 1999 and is currently being updated to reflect the latest community vision, infrastructure systems, and growth projections. This process creates an opportunity to work with residents and businesses to shape the future of the ways people get around in Philomath – including bicycles, sidewalks and trails, vehicles, transit, and freight. An updated TSP will enable the City to more effectively compete for limited federal and state funds by establishing clear support for specific transportation priorities.

Where we are in the process

The project team is just completing the "Understand" phase of the TSP update (see project schedule below). This included the development of project Goals and Objectives with the Citizen Advisory Committee, an evaluation of the current transportation system, and an assessment of how projected growth through the year 2040 might change travel conditions.

Following this Open House, we'll begin the development of recommended solutions for addressing Philomath's transportation needs for the next 20 years. The draft recommendations will be shared at a second Open House this summer.


